Protect Consumers from Harm

Music therapists work with vulnerable populations and music is a powerful therapy tool. When administered incorrectly, music can cause hearing loss, neurologic dysregulation, and overstimulation.



Increase Equitable Access

Without licensure, music therapy services are only available to residents who can pay out-of-pocket. Many reimbursement programs require licensure before providing coverage for medically necessary services.



Ensure a High Standard of Care

SB 5848 will recognize the national clinical and educational requirements for music therapists.
Licensure will not prohibit other professionals from using music in their practice.




Cost of Licensure
